Brief description of the side event

Background:

Morocco and Germany have a long-standing bilateral cooperation, including migration. The Moroccan-German **migration partnership** represents an example of how different stakeholders (including governments in countries of origin and countries of destination, migrant- and non-migrant-NGOs and private sector) are involved in the implementation of migration-related projects at the national, regional as well as at the local level. The **side event relates to the main goal of the 2017 GFMD RT 1.1 on policy coherence**, namely to "address possibilities to combine different tools in a multiple approach in order to shape adequate legal migration framework conditions on national and international levels".

After the presentation of a short movie on the German-Moroccan migration partnership, the keynote speeches by the German and Moroccan government representatives will showcase selected aspects and best practices of the migration partnership. Thereafter, the latest study results of the dashboard of indicators for measuring policy and institutional coherence for migration and development will be presented with particular attention to Morocco and Germany. In the subsequent panel discussion, the government representatives will have the opportunity to react to the study results, before opening the floor for a Q&A with the audience.
