




1. Monitoring migration trends in OECD and Key Partner countries



Permanent immigration by category of entry into selected OECD countries, 2015



Increase country coverage outside the OECD through regional monitoring systems (with OAS in LAC & with ADBI/ILO in Asia) – planned Observatory for Migration in Africa with IOM

Improve the monitoring of short term-movements and migration within free-mobility areas




4. Monitoring integration outcomes of immigrants and their children

Employment rates of foreign-born population aged 15-64 and not in education, by education level, 2012-13. Differences with native-born, in percentage points



Increase country-coverage and develop indicators at the regional and/or metropolitan level

Develop new indicators for social integration and for the specific issues in developing countries (informal employment, domestic work, etc.)



International Forum on Migration Statistics OECD-IOM-UNDESA; 15-16 January 2018 => create a community of migration data experts

Background

- International migration is increasing due to globalisation, demographic, technological and geopolitical changes
- An increasing gap between perceptions and reality
- Multiple initiatives and projects on migration statistics

Objectives

- Bring together all producers, analysts and users of migration statistics in a community of interest centred around migration measurement issues
- Approach migration phenomena from different angles with the perspective of both origin and destination countries

Expected outcomes

- Improve the global understanding of migration phenomena
- Create synergies between the different actors
- Disseminate innovation and advanced research

Organisation

- The Forum will be structured around a combination of plenary and parallel sessions, held over two days.
- A "call for sessions", with selection by a Forum scientific committee including renowned experts
- Partnerships with all relevant IOs and stakeholders



5 Key themes at the Forum

- 1. Migration measurement: concepts, definitions, disaggregation by migratory status, etc.
- 2. Innovation and synthesis of data sources: new sources and approaches to migration data collection and presentation, the need for real-time data, analysis of big data, etc.
- 3. Understanding migration through data: gaps in migration statistics, data to address policy concerns, etc.
- **4. Cooperation and data governance**: stakeholder coordination, data sharing/exchange, etc.
- **5. Capacity building**: strategies to enhance institutional capacity, data literacy, use of statistics, etc.
