











Migration is a defining feature of the 21st century.

Migrants are 3% of the world population and produce 9% of world GDP. If migration is poorly managed, migrants can be put at risk, communities can come under strain, and we fall behind on achieving the SDGs.

This is why the Global Compact for Migration (GCM) - the first global agreement to tackle migration flows through international cooperation - is essential. As a part of the implementation, follow up and review process for the GCM, key actions will be taken at this year's Global Forum on Migration and Development (GFMD) in Quito, Ecuador.

32% of migrants are youth. As such, we need to be present. Our voices must be heard.

50 young grassroots activists and experts in migration will come together to discuss these key topics at our second annual Youth Forum on the 19th and 20th of January. We received official recognition from the Chair of the GFMD, and we will host the Forum at the conference center where the Summit will be held.

The UNMGCY Youth Forum is supported by IOM and UNICEF. We have an established direct link to the GFMD Civil Society Day (CSD) mechanism, and will have 7 youth rapporteurs, through which youth voices will be inputting directly into the GFMD Civil Society discussion and the Summit.

We will be discussing key challenges and opportunities regarding migration and development. We will collect data on relevant youth-led action and solutions around the world. We will connect young people and create a network to accelerate the implementation of the GCM. We want to engage the GFMD decision-making process through meaningful participation from youth participants.

- **Engage us.** Give us a space at the decision-making table. Are you organizing a side event? Are you planning a roundtable? Make sure youth are represented. We are happy to help with identifying youth candidates to join. Can you bring youth in your delegation whether you are engaged in government, civil society, business, or mayoral mechanism?

- **Invest in us.** Fund youth to the Youth Forum and GFMD. Can you fund a participant from your country, region or thematic area? From a low-income background/country? From your own organization, or as part of your government delegation?

- **Count us in.** Are you preparing a dataset, report, speech, or intervention for the GFMD? Include youth priorities and perspectives. We will have a report after the Youth Forum, collecting inputs from youth on all key topics and roundtables of the GFMD. Include us in your key messages.

This is the draft programme of the Youth Forum, which will be held as an official side event to the 2019 GFMD Summit in Quito. The Youth Forum will focus on gathering youth perspectives in key thematic areas and from different regions, focusing on priorities for youth and children, and with attention to cross-cutting issues including gender, ethnicity, LGBTQ+, and disabilities. The Forum will also identify action-oriented solutions coupled with already existing successful initiatives addressing these issues, which can be suggested for replicating and scaling through partnerships with governments, civil society, and other stakeholders. We have a direct link to the Civil Society mechanisms, and the outcomes of the Forum will be presented directly to the GFMD through MGCY representation including during the Civil Society Day and the Common Space.

Regional Roundtable Round 1: During these roundtables participants will discuss the main issues affecting the region and what needs to be addressed.
