- 1. Established in 2000 between the ECOWAS Commission and IOM
- 2. Several important achievement
- 3. Never really institutionalized



Overarching Goals

- 1. Enhancing the implementation of the ECOWAS Common Approach on Migration;
- 2. Become a catalyst for spin-off projects;
- 3. Enhancing the conceptualization and implementation of more coherent and comprehensive migration policies;
- 4. Increasing cooperation amongst relevant partners (CSO, IO, Int. Partner) by establishing a common platform for dialogue;
- 5. Strengthening the mutually benefitting exchanges between the national, regional and global level;



Substance based on ECOWAS Common Approach

- Free Movement within the ECOWAS space
- Management of regular migration
- Policy Harmonisation of Migration and Development
- Controlling irregular migration and human trafficking particularly of women and children
- protect the rights of migrants, asylum seekers and refugees
- Gender and Migration



Structure

- Chaired: Country holding the ECOWAS Chairmanship
- Back-Office: ECOWAS Commission and partner such as IOM
- Frequency: Annually
